We offer two primary programmes, either ages 5-11 (Key Stages 1 and 2) or ages 3-7 (Nursery, Reception and Key Stage 1). We also offer a secondary programme ages 11-16 (Key Stages 3-4) with an opportunity to experience sixth form teaching. All trainees experience a wide range of schools including special schools and a Pupil Referral Unit.

We have a consistently high employment rate; every year. Over 50% gain employment in Stockton schools, many in the schools they have trained in. If you are employed in Stockton as an NQT, you gain access to a range of further training and support for early career development.

Our programme runs for 10 months, beginning in September, completing in early July. Successful completion of the programme leads to the award of Qualified Teacher Status (QTS) and a university accredited PGCE Master's level qualification. The PGCE is fully integrated into our programme and all PGCE work is undertaken in Stockton. You gain access to Sheffield Hallam's vast online library and all training is undertaken locally in Stockton.

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KEY FEATURES OF OUR PROGRAMME

Our Curriculum Vision

Our responsive, challenging curriculum aims to create confident, knowledgeable and reflective practitioners who are well placed to enter the profession as NQTs. The curriculum is well-balanced; trainees receive training in the right things at the right time; its golden threads contribute to the coherence and sequencing of the programme so that it is knowledge- rich and provides exposure to a variety of evidence based theories and practice.

Centre-Based Training

The autumn and spring terms begin with blocks of centre-based training which are held at our dedicated training space at the Education Centre (a bespoke training block attached to Stockton Sixth Form College).

The training takes the form of taught sessions delivered by experienced, expert, outstanding Stockton teachers and specialists. The sessions, whilst grounded in theory, focus on providing practical strategies and techniques that will support you when you are teaching in school. There are also many opportunities for you to learn from and teach your fellow trainees through sessions that allow you to share your successes, ideas and challenges with each other and reflect on your school experiences.

In school

Our programme has a strong experiential learning focus, with over 70% of your training based in schools, allowing you to embed and develop the practical skills gained through centre-based training.

You have a host (main placement) school that you will work with the majority of the year (autumn and summer terms). Within that school, you are allocated a mentor just for you who is there to work with you and support you every day. This approach allows you to build strong relationships with your school and pupils and truly become a member of staff like any other teacher in the school.

Your second school experience takes place in the spring term for a shorter placement of approximately 6 weeks.

School-Based Development

Your training in school is personalised to meet your unique needs and will include a variety of activities including focused lesson observations of colleagues, weekly one-to-one sessions with mentors, participation in your school's staff training, advice with planning and teaching, focused meetings with school specialists, colleague and pupil shadowing and much more.

Teaching

At first, trainees are not expected to take responsibility for a teaching timetable. Time will be spent observing experienced colleagues and learning about the craft of the classroom and gradually, your mentor will support you to be ready to teach a full lesson. Towards the end of the first half term trainees teach for 30% of the school week. The teaching commitment increases to 50% in the spring term and 70% in the summer term of the training year. This is designed to support you to be ready for employment as a newly qualified teacher (NQT) when you will have a 90% timetable.

KEY FEATURES OF OUR PROGRAMME

Assessment for Qualified Teacher Status

All trainees must demonstrate that they have met the Teachers' Standards by the end of the training programme. Trainee progress is reviewed continuously through lesson observations, mentor meetings, professional tutor visits and written submissions.

Assessment for PGCE (60 Masters Credits)

Our University-accredited PGCE programme is assessed through 2 assignments spread across the year based on your work in school. We work with Sheffield Hallam University, rated 'Outstanding' for Education. All PGCE training takes place in Stockton.

Mentoring and Support

As well as your class mentor who will be working with you every day, you also work with a Professional Tutor, an experienced, expert practitioner external to the school, who will work with you and your school regularly to support you on your journey as well as monitor that you are getting the support you need in school.

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ENTRY REQUIREMENTS & FUNDING

Academic Qualifications:

An Honours degree at 2:2 or above

For secondary applications, it is preferable for your degree to have some connection to the subject you want to teach. Where this is not the case, relevant A Level qualifications will be taken into account as well as any other relevant experience.

GCSE Maths grade A*-C/grade 4 or above

GCSE English/English Language grade A*-C/grade 4 or above

GCSE Science grade A*-C/grade 4 or above (Primary applicants only)

UK Equivalency Qualifications:

O Level grade A-C/1-6

Full GCSE equivalency qualifications for initial teacher training NOT Level 2 Functional Skills.

IELTS Level 7 or above

Overseas Equivalency Qualifications:

If you gained your qualifications outside of the UK, you are required to provide proof that your qualifications are equivalent to UK qualifications. UK NARIC provides advice on comparisons of international qualifications against the UK's qualifications. Please visit their website www.naric.org.uk

Checks:

We operate robust safeguarding practices. Successful applicants are required to undertake the enhanced Disclosure and Barring Service check, and complete a medical health questionnaire to confirm fitness to train to teach which may be subject to an occupational health referral. This will be arranged by the Partnership. Offers made to applicants will be conditional until all of the above criteria have been fulfilled.

Tuition Fees:

The cost of our programme is £9,250. You are able to apply to the Student Loans Company to cover the cost of the tuition fee in the same way as you did for your undergraduate studies and you may be eligible for a maintenance loan. Some trainees choose to finance their studies independently, which we can accommodate.

If you are responsible for Council Tax we are able to provide you with a letter to confirm your eligibility for discount as a full time student.



ENTRY REQUIREMENTS **& FUNDING**

Bursaries:

Some subjects attract a tax free bursary, paid over ten monthly instalments via the initial teacher training provider. For further information regarding bursaries and scholarships please visit
