- Help your child learn their tricky words

Here are some ideas for activities you can do with your child at home.

Personal Social And Emotional Development

- Continue to encourage your child to wash their hands after going to the toilet, to encourage independence and hygiene at school
- Continue to encourage your child to fasten their own coats
- Play board games to encourage sharing and turn taking

Communication, Language and Literacy

• Write lower case letters m.a.s.d.t i,n,p,q,o,c,k,ck,u,b,f,e,l,h,sh,r,j,v,y,w,th,z,ch,qu,x,ng,nk

PE - Monday Afternoons (Children need to wear their PE kits) RB

Friday Afternoons (Children need to wear their PE kits) RH

Forest Schools - Tuesday Mornings (Warm clothes are essential)

Yoga - Wednesday Afternoon (Children need to wear their PE kits)

- Spell simple CVC words e.g. cat, hat, sat, mat
- Write simple captions 'a cat in a hat'
- Share your child's reading for pleasure book and talk about the setting, characters and events

Mathematics

- Read, recognise and order numbers from 1 20
- Attempt to write numerals from 1 20
- Count up to 20 objects
- Count in 2's
- Count in 10's

Topic theme -Winter Tales

- Draw a picture of someone dressed for a cold winter day
- Design a winter jumper or hat
- Design and build a winter shelter for a polar bear
- Finished projects can be sent in to school to share during Show and Tell
